HOLY SMOKE AND THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD



Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh.1

141 A Psalm of David.

- O Lord, I call upon you; hasten to me!

 Give ear to my voice when I call to you!
- ² Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice! ²

⁸ And when he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each holding a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints.⁹³

If you examine the central magi in the image above, you can see him offering smoking incense to the Lord Jesus. It seems a funny kind of thing to do. How is Jesus going to use burnt frankincense? It's odd until one considers that the context for the production of most churchly imagery is the worship of the Church. And, this gift-giving visit of the magi is indeed an event of real worship. Why is he offering the incense in this manner? Because this is how the Church offers it in its Services. A thurifer (the minister who swings the censer) censes the altar, the place where our Lord's body and blood are laid prior to the distribution, and where the monetary gifts are brought forward for blessing. The incense marks the center of the Church's worship, the altar, and thereby also the Lord Jesus Christ as He is present for His gathered disciples. Further, it is a visible sign of the prayer and thanksgiving that is due the Incarnate Lord – the "worthy" one, as the

whole heavenly host confesses in the vision from Revelation. As Psalm 41 has it, the holy smoke rises as the congregation's prayer also "rises" to the heavens.

We should also be quick to note that the Lord Jesus accepts the gifts: the gold, the frankincense, and the myrrh. What does a baby need with any of these things? Sure, they could be for the entire Holy Family (Joseph, Mary, and the Lord Jesus). More important than this is recognize them as signs of something more profound. They point to the reality of Gentile offering, of Gentile faith; that the Gentiles will recognize the Saving Child and claim Him as their Lord. Jesus accepts their gifts even as he continues to accept our own forms of self-offering. Jesus is manifesting Himself as Savior to the Gentiles! What wonderful news for us!

The Church has in its history reflected on the offerings of these rather curious figures, "magi", as they are called. The foreign-born astrologers from the East want in on this thing that is happening with Jesus, and Jesus is pleased. The gold is obvious, the world's wealth is Jesus' creation and is rightfully returned to Him to be used as He sees fit. The frankincense is one of constituent parts of the old Tabernacle/Temple worship and is now offered to the new and abiding Temple of God, Jesus Christ. Myrrh was used in burial rites for preparing bodies... and Jesus will make use of this as well, before His crucified body is placed in the tomb.

But, I can hear the objections. Isn't this a "Catholic" thing? Well, perhaps, if by that you mean a practice that many thousands of Christians throughout time and space have observed in their worship of the Triune God. Yes, Lutherans too. More than this, it's Biblical. God Himself declares that He appreciates incense, particularly when used in the pure worship of the Church of Christ. Don't believe me? Take a look at Exodus chapter 30:

30 "You shall make an altar on which to burn incense; you shall make it of acacia wood... ⁷ And Aaron shall burn fragrant incense on it. Every morning when he dresses the lamps he shall burn it, ⁸ and when Aaron sets up the lamps at twilight, he shall burn it, a regular incense offering before the Lord throughout your generations.⁴

God even provides a recipe for the use of incense in the Tabernacle:

³⁴The Lord said to Moses, "Take sweet spices, stacte, and onycha, and galbanum, sweet spices with pure frankincense (of each shall there be an equal part), ³⁵ and make an incense blended as by the perfumer, ⁸ seasoned with salt, pure and holy.

³⁶You shall beat some of it very small, and put part of it before the testimony in the tent of meeting where I shall meet with you. It shall be most holy for you.⁵

While it is true that the use of incense in worship is not something commanded by the Lord for the Christian Church, it is also true that the heavenly worship depicted in St. John's vision in Revelation includes it. See the prefatory citations above. We can and should say that while it is not an essential part of Christian worship, it is a *free thing*, something that the Christian Church may do to beautify her worship when and where she finds it to be fitting.

And what is the point? As with everything we do in worship, it has *significance* or *sign value*. It is a visible sign of the invisible things we offer, it renders our invisible praise, prayer, thanksgiving, and faith, visible in a sacramental way.

Of course, the best visible sacrifice we may offer the Lord Jesus is the "reasonable service" enjoined upon us by St. Paul (Romans 12:1) – faith that clings to Christ, proclaims Him, makes use of His gifts of grace, lives a life of new obedience, and offers itself to in good works toward the neighbor. This is finally the point of all that we do as we worship and exercise our faith together in the Divine Service. It is our constant "Gentile gift", offered in response to the saving work of our Lord.

This Epiphany, consider the ways in which your own lives may be given in their totality to the Lord as a signs of faith, love, and hope in the God manifest in human flesh. Consider how to make your praise, thanks, and service physically and visibly present to Jesus. As He has become *manifest* (the meaning of Epiphany) to us, let us manifest ourselves to Him as His faithful people. Consider the resources you have and lay them at His holy feet. Such gifts please our Lord, and He renders them holy in the work of the Christian Church.
