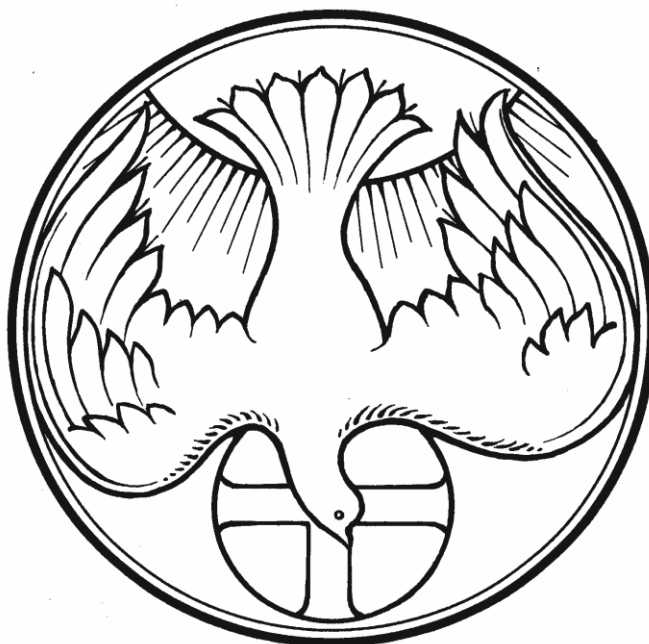

located under the SERVICE OF THE SACRAMENT heading in this bulletin. It is our hope and prayer that all communicants will embrace our Confession of Faith as baptized Christians who desire to receive the Lord's body and blood in the Sacrament.

Announcement of the Day

This Sunday of the Church Year is named *Cantate*, “O Sing”, from the first line of the Introit for the Day.
